We GIVE THANKS for the many blessings that have enabled us to gather here.

We GIVE THANKS to the ancestors for the path they have paved and for the protection and guidance they continue to offer as we journey forward.

We GIVE THANKS to one another knowing that we can only do what we do by working together respectfully and peacefully.

We acknowledge that the land we gather on is the traditional territory of many nations including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnabeg, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee and the Wendat peoples and is now home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples. This includes the many peoples, named and unnamed, who have stewarded this land before our arrival.

The territory is the subject of the Dish with One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement between the Iroquois Confederacy and the Ojibwe and allied nations to peaceably care for and share the resources around the Great Lakes. We are Treaty Peoples, including those of us who came here as settlers - either in this generation or in generations past — and those of us who came here involuntarily, particularly as a result of the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade.

We are grateful to be able to share this space with so many knowledge-keepers, including the courageous artists with whom dance Immersion collaborates every day.

For 2023-2024, we have put together a season spotlighting projects that move beautifully through deeply-researched ancestral legacies to healing to reclamation of unapologetic self-expression.

For us at *dance* Immersion, we raise a toast to legacy, transition, and a bright future! I have been connected to and benefitted from the work of Vivine Scarlett and *dance* Immersion for almost 30 years. My first paid performance was with my mentor Ronald Taylor in *dance* Immersion's second-ever Showcase Presentation. Since then, Vivine and *dance* Immersion have given me transformative opportunities to perform in further Showcases through companies I was working for; presented my work via the In-Studio Showcase; and entrusted me to help educate and mentor next generation artists as a facilitator for mentorship programming.

From an early age I was taught to give back, and I learned that we must help one another move forward with actions over words. In that spirit, I have donated to, volunteered for, invited, promoted, and collaborated with *dance* Immersion over those same years. Vivine and *dance* Immersion have witnessed and encouraged my development as a dancer, choreographer, administrator, programmer, and curator for 29 years. What an honour to be invited to continue Vivine's legacy by serving as *dance* Immersion's Executive Director beginning in 2024.

Understanding the responsibility and privilege of this position, we have been embarking on this transition since the end of 2020. 30th ANNIVERSARY SEASON OVERVIEW

Studio Presentation & Artist Talk

RHODNIE DÉSIR (Montréal)

BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek – Studio Version + Conference Discussion

OCTOBER 19 & 20, 2023

Venue: Winchester Street Theatre

A studio performance and an artist talk about the research and choreographic development of the work.

Our 30th Anniversary Season begins in October 2023 with the studio presentation of Rhodnie Désir's **BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek**. This is a full-circle moment for us. In 2013, *dance* Immersion presented a brief excerpt of the very beginnings of this dance piece in one of our Showcases. Rhodnie has since expanded the piece into a journey named **BOW'T TRAIL**, touring the Americas for research and development and performing the work globally. On its 10-year anniversary, and our 30th, **BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek** will return to Toronto for the first time since that 2013 debut. This studio version of the work will be accompanied by a conference discussion with Rhodnie about the development of the work. Note: This studio event is a pre-cursor to the performance of the full BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek that dance Immersion plans to present in Toronto in April 2025.

Synopsis: BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek, the ambassador piece of the BOW'T series, is

a conversation between the present and the past, channeled through the body of Désir in which more than 130 testimonies collected on 7 lands of the Americas still reside. The choreographer, driven by a desire and a need to transcend her origins, has been carrying research in the Americas since 2015 to immerse herself with the African cultures and rhythms deployed by the peoples who were taken there.

We will hear from a variety of artists and arts workers on the subject. The series begins with an Online Bantaba Zoom gathering that establishes key discussion points, and then leads into further conversations on Instagram Live in the weeks to follow. International Presentation & Workshops

FERNANDO ANUANG'A (Nairobi, Kenya) TRADITIONAL FUTURE

JANUARY 16 – 20, 2024

Venue: The Theatre Centre

North American Premiere – Fernando Anuang'a presents his internationally-renowned contemporary Maasaï dance solo, *TRADITIONAL FUTURE*, in North America for the first time! With this work he explores: How do we evolve tradition toward modernity without obliterating its tracks, without betraying one's roots?

Fernando Anuang'a is an autodidact artist (self-taught dancer/choreographer). He is supported and inspired by Maasaï songs, his ancestral memories, and his community's vocal rhythmic power for his vocabulary. He is driven by a will to take tradition into the future, and continuously researches ways for Maasaï dance to live fully in this era. While tourists have exploited the image of the Maasaï jump tradition, Fernando's practice instead infuses this cultural vertical energy with evolving Maasaï undulation gestures. For his third solo, *TRADITIONAL FUTURE*, he stays loyal to the Moran (Maasaï warrior) tradition as a symbolic root, while finding a deeper energy and more liberating form of self-expression to bring the tradition into the future.

In-Studio Presentation & Workshops IMMERSION MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

SATURDAY, MARCH 16, 2024

Venue Partner: Canada's National Ballet School

In March 2024 the public will be able to connect with the budding dance works of mentees who are working with mentors to guide the development of their pieces in our *Immersion Mentorship Program*. Beyond this In-Studio Showcase, we will be offering a week-long educational workshop series for all emerging dance artists covering how to research, develop, and craft a dance piece for successful presentation, as well as how to collaborate on, fund, and promote their work effectively to build communities of support around their practices.

As with our previous mentorship programs, we aim to improve the knowledge, skills, resources, and networks of emerging Black dance artists. We have seen how an improvement in knowledge and quality of work inspires other artists of all generations, and helps our evolving stories live on. Black artists have left profound imprints across this country historically; the *Immersion Mentorship Program* will extend and deepen those footprints and help leave a clear path for more Black dance artists of the future.

Showcase Presentation CINNAMOON COLLECTIVE & PULGA MUCHOCHOMA (Toronto)

MAY 2 – 4, 2024

Venue Partner: Canadian Stage - Berkeley Street Theatre

In April 2024 we have an exciting Double-Bill Showcase Presentation featuring new work by CinnaMoon Collective (Nickeshia Garrick + Irma Villafuerte) and Pulga Muchochoma under the themes of ancestry, healing, and self-reclamation.

The programme opens with CinnaMoon Collective's *SURRENDERED SPIRITS*. This is a new commissioned work (in partnership with Kaeja d'Dance) that delves into the truths and layers of fractured childhood stories that have influenced our disconnection and perception of the world and family. This work is a contemporary dance-theatre immersive experience that creates a vortex of physical and emotional energy between expressive racialized bodies, live music, and illustrative atmosphere. Surrendered Spirits rides the edge through physical and emotional virtuosity, guiding the performers and audience through collective healing from a place of breath, mutual care and reclaiming of self.

Pulga Muchochoma continues with the work *dance* Immersion commissioned for the 2023 IABD International Conference & Festival of Blacks in Dance - an extended version of which will be performed in the Fall for Dance North Festival 2023. *MÀSCARA* features choreography and movement performance by Pulga, and musical composition and performance by Kobèna Aquaa-Harrison. It delves into the subject of our true selves and the masks that we wear: We all have more than one face... From their perspective, outsiders may see one image at first glance, but there is always more to learn about the individual behind the mask.


