We GIVE THANKS for the many blessings that have enabled us to gather here.

We GIVE THANKS to the ancestors for the path they have paved and for the protection and guidance they continue to offer as we journey forward.

We GIVE THANKS to one another knowing that we can only do what we do by working together respectfully and peacefully.

We acknowledge that the land we gather on is the traditional territory of many nations including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnabeg, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee and the Wendat peoples and is now home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples. We are grateful to be able to share this space with so many knowledgekeepers, including the courageous artists with whom *dance* Immersion collaborates every day.

Join us for an exciting exploration of dance that spans the breadth of contemporary aerial dance, Krump, traditional and street dances from Nigeria, hip hop/contemporary fusion, tap dance, contemporary African, and Afro-fusion.

Toronto Premiere! Presented by *dance* Immersion Hosted by Tarragon Theatre, Toronto » November 20 – 22, 2024, 7:30 PM

Black & Rural is an artistic inquiry into the hearts and minds of Black folks tucked away on Canada's countryside. Project lead, Shayna Jones, aims to seek out, honour, and showcase stories from rurally based Blacks (like herself) to nuance and challenge the monolith of what matters to Black Lives. Created and performed by **Shayna Jones** and produced by **Pi Theatre**, Black & Rural weaves spoken word, movement, music, and verbatim theatre together in a spellbinding performance that is resonating across the country.

A Black & Rural Community Workshop & Performance Retreat at Adinkra Farm

Shayna Jones, *dance* **Immersion & b current Performing Arts** are collaborating to offer Ontario-based African Diasporic artists a communal learning experience that includes embodied storytelling workshops, informal performances, collective drumming, and a home-cooked African-Caribbean meal!

PRESENTATION & EDUCATION DJATA: CONVERSATION OF THE MANDEN (Excerpt): Aly Keita

Presentation: In this duet work-in-progress showing, Aly draws inspiration from the Manding epic, one of the most significant founding narratives of West African oral traditions, dating back to the 13th century. In this piece, he focuses on the central character, Soundjata Keita, and the segment of the legend known as the "Awakening of the Lion." Through his dance—acrobatic and percussive—Aly embodies the messages conveyed by the griots' sung tales, while also reflecting his personal journey in a continuous dialogue between strength and vulnerability. *dance* Immersion will present the full version of this piece with additional cast members, in the 2025-2026 season.

Discussion: In this extended post-performance discussion designed to enlighten participants on deepening musical practice through movement, Aly discusses his musical creative process is composite: he shapes the sound environment while developing his movements, creating a loop where music and dance respond to each other.

Workshop: African rhythms and melodies in action – a bodily experience. Aly Keita uses exercises in singing, dancing, and physical coordination to develop rhythmic awareness, encouraging participants to feel and express rhythm and melodies in their bodies.

PRESENTATION BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek: Rhodnie Désir Créations

Following our 2023 Toronto presentation of the studio excerpt of this work, we are proud to present the stunning full-length BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek in April 2025. Since 2015, Rhodnie Désir has been exploring the Americas in search of Afro-descendant cultures, including Martinique, Haiti, Brazil, Mexico, Halifax and New Orleans. The choreographer, driven by a desire and a need to transcend her origins, has been immersing herself in the African cultures and rhythms of the peoples who were taken to these lands. The resulting performance piece, BOW'T TRAIL Retrospek, is a conversation between the present and the past, channeled through the body of Rhodnie Désir, in which more than 130 testimonies collected on lands of the Americas still reside. In this award-winning interdisciplinary work, Désir transcends polyrhythmic and majestic textures and sonorities while her body is mysteriously enveloped by video projections and plural memories connecting the audience to the universe of her travels. She is accompanied on stage by two maestros: Engone Endong and Jahsun. The matinée is presented in partnership with DanceWorks.

dance Immersion will be a company in residence at Tarragon Theatre beginning in the 24-25 Season!

Tarragon Theatre is a creation and playwrights theatre. We seek to create theatre that investigates artistic form, from non-traditional practices and methods of storytelling, to movement, music or non-text-based performance - all toward creating enriching and provocative theatre experiences. Equally a hub for creation, development and education - Tarragon is Canada's Neighbourhood Theatre.

Within this interdisciplinary partnership:

- Tarragon Theatre will host presentations curated by *dance* Immersion at its wonderful Toronto venue
- dance Immersion and Tarragon will periodically develop and produce co-curated new works by local artists, and
- Our two organizations will collaborate on an exciting new shared professional development program for dance and theatre artists.

Our first such professional development program is **DTM Creation Lab**, a twoweek paid creation residency that will provide four artists with dramaturgical, musical, and choreographic mentorship and development space. **DTM (dance/ theatre/music) Creation Lab** will foster cross-disciplinary collaboration, spark inspiration, and create shared insights and experiences between dance and theatre artists that help build meaningful, career-changing connections. The two-week intensive will culminate in an In-Studio Showcase of the artists' works-in-progress.

DTM Creation Lab will run from **June 16 through June 27, 2025** with resident artists selected from an open call in early 2025.
